Calvin W. Roberts, MD



Calvin W. Roberts, MD, came to Well Cornell in 1982 as Chief of the Cornea Service and was promoted to Clinical Professor in 1993. He developed the wide-field specular microscope for clinical evaluation of the corneal endothelium, did extensive research on ophthalmic non-steroidals and post-operative cystoid macular edema, and pioneered the use of ophthalmic non-steroidals for preoperative inflammation prophylaxis. As a practicing ophthalmologist he performed over 10,000 cataract surgeries and 5,000 refractive and other corneal surgeries.

After Cornell, Dr. Roberts served as Executive Vice President and Chief Medical Officer of Bausch + Lomb, where he coordinated global development and research efforts across their vision care, pharmaceutical and surgical business units. Dr. Roberts co-founded a specialty pharmaceutical company and served as an Independent Director on multiple corporate boards.

In 2020, Dr. Roberts became the President and Chief Executive Officer of Lighthouse Guild, the leading organization dedicated to providing exceptional services that inspire people who are visually impaired to attain their goals. He was included in Crain's New York Business 2021 list of Notable In Health Care and represents Lighthouse Guild on the American Academy of Ophthalmology's Vision Rehabilitation Committee.

In addition to his role at Lighthouse Guild, Dr. Roberts is a Program Manager at the new federal health agency, ARPA-H, and launched in January 2024 THEA, a program to restore vision by eye transplantation.

Dr. Roberts hosts the podcast series, "On Tech and Vision", where innovators discuss how rapidly evolving assistive technology creates equity among those who are visually impaired.

Dr. Roberts received his AB from Princeton University, his MD from Columbia University, was an intern and resident at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital in New York and did his Cornea fellowships in Boston at the Massachusetts Eye and Infirmary and the Schepens Eye Institute.

Dr. Roberts and his wife Andrea have three children and five grandchildren.

John Milton McLean, MD

John Milton McLean was Professor and Chairman of the Division of Ophthalmology at The New York Hospital-Cornell University Medical College from 1939 to 1968. He initiated the residency training program at The New York Hospital with a combined full time and voluntary staff.

Among notable departmental achievements during this period were the establishment of the first Eye Bank (later moved to Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital), the introduction of steroids in the treatment of ophthalmic disease as well as cryopexy and numerous other innovations in the treatment of retinal disease.

Dr. McLean was universally recognized as one of the leading educators of his era. The John Milton McLean Chair for the Department of Ophthalmology was established in 1979 and grateful patients and alumni established the McLean Medal in 1981. It is awarded annually by the alumni to an ophthalmologist who has made significant contributions in teaching, research and clinical practice.
